Abstract

Did you know that research conducted by Harvard University, the Carnegie Foundation and Stanford Research Center found that 85 percent of workplace success is attributed to people skills (also called soft skills), and only 15 percent of job success comes from technical (hard) skills? This professional development course (PDC) will help you hone your leadership people skills, with special emphasis on communicating effectively, emotional intelligence, and managing conflict.

Using a combination of lecture and group discussion, attendees will get the opportunity to compare good and bad leadership people skills, help each other solve work issues and develop a leadership people skills action plan.

While we will be focusing on three people skills –Communicating Effectively, Managing Conflict, and Emotional Intelligence – attendees will find that other skills, such as problem solving, managing teams, time management, adaptability, creativity, working well under pressure, etc., will be woven into the course.




Joy Erdman, CIH, CSP, FAIHA, Joy Solutions, LLC
